How can the patient evaluate quality of care?

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No conflicts of interest to declare

- Hippocrates oath clearly excludes any conflict
- Convergence of interest is about patient's health, life, and quality of life

Proposed alternate titles

 What does the doctor think the patient thinks and wants (the eternal communication process question)

 What does the ESGO can do to foster the relevance of patient's questions (and the doctor's knowledge) on quality?

What is low quality?

- Sheer ignorance
- Inability to master the technique
- Unavailability of equipment or drug
- Overloaded with work, no time to learn, train, speak

How does the patient can impact

- Asking questions about benefits/risks of the procedures/treatments (survival, disease-free survival, quality of life)
- Asking questions about standards and guidelines
- Asking whether there is or not an alternative option
- Asking about caseload/experience
- Taking a second, independent, expert opinion check the names on Pubmed – before treatment
- Beware of forums and personal network, rather rely on independent doctors, however not always relevant

The role of ESGO/ENGAGe

- Elaborate all the necessary documentation on the state of the art (recommendations and guidelines) in the (geographical) European context, and associated quality indicators
- Make them available to members and non members (textbooks, website, e-academy
- Foster patients involvement by translating the products in « lay » language (English to English, then English to local language)
