Having a poster at the main congress poster room will give you a chance to present to all congress attendees your projects/achievements/successful campaigns.

For the poster viewing is going to be again used motto: **"ORANGE MEETS PURPLE"** because there is no better way of reaching so many doctors and patients/patient advocates at once!

We have prepared the **ppt presentation** (see attached) with the abstract preparation process explanation. Please make sure you study the ppt presentation and if something is not clear to you, you can send the questions to: barbora.freund@esgo.org and we will get back to you with the answer.

You are not expected to write an academic abstract but a project abstract (you can read more about it on page 3 of the attached ppt).

The **deadline** for submission of the abstract is **June 15th**. You will get more information about the Patient Advocacy Seminar itself in June but be sure we are preparing a great scientific programme with the top specialists in the field of gynaecological cancer as well as the psychologists. We have returned to the format of Roundtables to allow you to have closer and more intensive debates and we hope you will also enjoy the interactive workshops.

Once your abstract is accepted, you will be sent instructions on how to prepare a poster including the required dimensions and suggested layout. Please note that this year the poster session will be located in the main congress exhibition. Also, there will be time allocated in the programme for you to briefly present your poster and you can have a discussion at your poster.

So please, do not miss the opportunity to share your projects/achievements/successful campaigns not only with the other ENGAGe Members but also with the ESGO doctors. We are looking forward to your abstracts!
